### Workshop on "Pathya Ahara Kalpana" Organized by Gujarat Ayurved University

To maintain a healthy state and to treat ailments more effectively, the right diet plays a crucial role. In both of these situations, the method of cooking the food, along with the ingredients, is essential. Different ways of cooking food are referred to as "Ahara Kalpana" (food preparation methods). With the aim of teaching these food preparation techniques and their significance effectively to Ayurvedic students, and making them accessible to the general public, Gujarat Ayurved University, Jamnagar's Board of Swasthavritta, under the guidance of the university's Vice Chancellor Vaidya Shri Mukul Patel, organized a two-day workshop on "Pathya Ahara Kalpana" September 21 and 22, 2024, at Padma Dungri with the collaboration of the Forest Department.













The workshop, hosted by Shri O.H. Nazar Ayurved College, Surat, was designed for faculty members of the Swasthavritta (preventive medicine) department from affiliated colleges of the university. During the workshop, various food preparations (dishes) as mentioned in ancient Ayurvedic texts were presented by the faculty members, focusing on maintaining the health of healthy individuals and supporting patients in their recovery process.

Three expert speakers shared detailed insights on food science aspects supported by yoga and Ayurveda. The speakers included Vaidya Arpan Bhatt, Dean of Planning and Development and Head of the Department of Swasthavritta at ITRA, Jamnagar, Vaidya Atish Oswal, Professor and Head of the Swasthavritta Department at Siddhakala Ayurved College, Sangamner, and Vaidya Rahul Jadhav, Associate Professor and Head of the Department of Swasthavritta and Yoga at Parul Institute of Ayurveda
